Youth Opportunity

ALICE IN IOWA

ALICE is <u>Asset-Limited</u>, <u>Income-Constrained</u>, <u>Employed</u>. These are households in Iowa that earn above the Federal Poverty Level yet struggle to meet the basic needs budget, including housing, food, childcare, health care, and transportation. ALICE earns income, pays taxes, and contribute to Iowa's economy, yet the household income is not enough to meet the basic survival budget.
